Dear Parents and Carers

As you are aware from my previous communications, the membership of the NEU voted to take further industrial action in schools across our region and the country.

The next possible strike days are on Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May.

Year 6, our Inclusion Centre (PIC) and our Nursery will definitely be open on <u>both</u> days. 2BR will be open on the <u>first</u> strike day. As soon as I find out about other classes I will let you know.

You may want to start to consider alternative child care for these dates and make arrangements for any last minute changes.

If classes are open, attendance in mandatory.

I would like to take this opportunity to explain why some teachers are taking strike action as some of what has been reported has been inaccurate.

- In real terms, the Institute for Fiscal Studies has reported Teachers pay has gone down by 11% between 2010 and 2022. During the same period Nurses pay has gone down by 10% and Police by 9%.
- The NEU has argued that pay rises for teachers is not fully funded so this will have to be taken from existing school budgets resulting in less money to spend on children
- There is a workforce recruitment problem. Research by the NEU 44% of teachers plan to leave schools altogether by 2027, with 52% saying their workload is 'unmanageable'. The Guardian newspaper has reported that a third of teachers who qualified in the last 10 years have left the profession

As a school we want to recruit and retain the best possible staff to teach and care for your children. Some teachers may choose to go on strike, which is their legal right, to try and protect the future of their profession and your children.

Unions and Government are not publically discussing a resolution at the moment so I have no way of knowing what will happen next but as soon as I receive any new information, I will let you know via Studybugs, the school website and our School Facebook Pages.
