In PSHF

Our Jigsaw unit this term is 'Changing Me' We will be thinking about all the changes that happen to us as we get older. This includes changes to our bodies, new responsibilities we may have and how these changes might make us feel.

What changes are you looking forward to in the future?

English

As writers this half term, we will be learning about our wonderful world and comparing it to the planet presented in the book 'Blue Planet.' We'll be using our sentence patterns and good vocabulary choices to create different moods in writing and also thinking about stories that teach us messages and symbols. Do you know any stories like this already?

History

As historians this half term, we are learning about the Anglo-Saxons and investigating what they changed in Britain after the Romans. Our trip to Butser Ancient Farm will help us learn more!

Maths

As mathematicians this half term, we will be revisiting fractions and decimals. We will also apply different skills in problem solving contexts and revisit any areas of learning that we have found tricky. We will finish off learning more about 2D and 3D shapes!

Can you remember how to use the bus stop method? Try solving $128 \div 4$ to see if you can!

Science

As scientists, we are learning about living things and their habitats. We will learn how to recognise living things and group them in a variety of ways. We will then explore and use classification keys to help identify different living things. Finally we think about how changes in the environment affects living things.

Art

As artists we will be creating 3D sculptures using clay and natural resources.

In RE, we will be thinking about the theme of prayer and worship and if people need to go to church to show they are Christians?

What can you remember about Christianity?
