
# **Reception Newsletter Summer 2 2023**

If you have any questions please speak to one of the teachers.


### **Prime Areas**

Communication and language, physical development and personal emotional and social development

The children will be talking about different journeys from stories and their own experience. They will also talk about the different animals they see on our trip to the farm. They will be learning new vocabulary to help them describe and talk about what they are doing.

They will be continuing to practise forming letters correctly in their writing. They will be learning to use tools safely.

The children will be talking about changes and how they feel about moving on to Year One.

# Reading


# **Specific areas**

Literacy, mathematics, Understanding the world and expressive arts

The children will be listening to and talking about a range of stories about journeys and linking them to their own experiences. They will continue to practise writing using their letter sounds to make lists, labels, tickets and stories.

In maths, they will be learning about number patterns and counting beyond 20. They will talk about numbers that are greater or less than another number. They will also practise adding and subtracting in different ways.

Children will be looking closely at the farm animals they see on our trip and compare how they are the same and different. They will also be comparing the different places they visit and talk about what they like about the envi-
