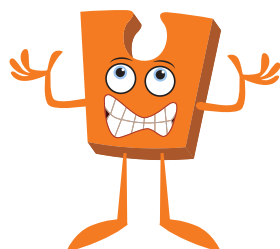




## Celebrating Difference Puzzle Map - Ages 5-6

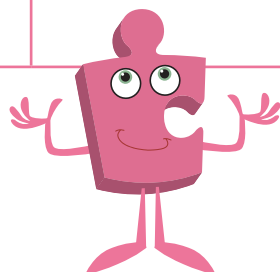

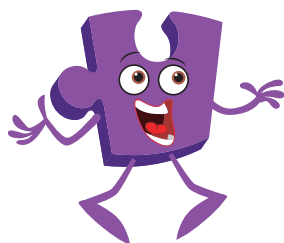

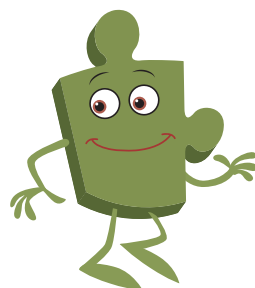
