How can you help people and help the world?




Maths

We will begin the half term looking at multiplication and division.

We have been working hard at counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Why not impress your adults with your counting?



We will also continue looking at addition and subtraction. What can you remember about adding and subtracting?



Can you learn these?
Remember you need a quick recall of the facts in any order!

$1 \times 5 = 5 \quad 10 \times 5 = 50$

$2 \times 5 = 10 \quad 11 \times 5 = 55$

$3 \times 5 = 15 \quad 12 \times 5 = 60$

$4 \times 5 = 20$

$5 \times 5 = 25$

$6 \times 5 = 30$

$7 \times 5 = 35$

Home Learning

A fun few ways to practise spellings at home:

Stairs: Write the words as if they are stairs, adding one letter each time: S, Sp, Spe, Spel, Spell
