In PSHE

We will be focusing on anti-Bullying – caring friendships and respectful relationships.

PE will be on **Thursday** afternoon so please ensure your child has a PE kit in school.

Year 6 is an important year for your child and we would like to make it a journey the children enjoy and remember as they prepare to move onto secondary school. This is a job we take seriously and would like to ask for your support at home to ensure that the children not only reach their full potential but are relaxed and calm on their journey. Over the year your child will have spellings and homework tasks to help support this and we would like to ask that if possible you support your child with these.

English

This half-term we will be enjoying the book *Skellig* by David Almond. The children will be studying this book in reading time as well as completing written work based on the novel. We will also be learning about character and writing character descriptions so that the reader can empathise with the character.

In RE, we will be exploring the significance of Mary as Jesus' mother to Christians and focusing on which parts of the nativity story are important and why.

Science

Pupils will identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system; describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood; recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function; and describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.

Maths

To start the second autumn term, we will be looking at division and focusing on formal methods to help pupils select appropriate methods to enable them to be efficient.

We will be challenging our mathematical brains by spending several weeks learning about fractions.

While studying these areas of maths, we will continue to focus on our arithmetic skills and continue to improve our rapid recall of multiplication and division facts.

Times tables

Across the school, children are working on improving their times tables and we would really appreciate your support at home too.

Please ask your child what table they are focusing on each week as it does change every week and give them some questions e.g. whilst on the bus or waiting in line at the supermarket.

Geography

We will be learning all about the Earth's natural resources. As geographers, we will consider how different resources help us produce energy; our use of renewable resources; and how different products such as wood and steel are traded with other countries.
