What gifts would Christians today give baby Jesus?

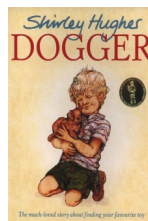
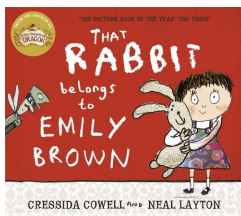
## History

In phonics this half term, the children will spend time recapping sounds they have been taught previously and beginning to learn some of the new alternative pronunciations. They will continue to read 3x times a week in school with this book coming home for them to read to you.

In PSHE this half term, we will be talking about similarities and differences between the children in our class and valuing these differences.
