How can I help with reading at home?

With your support, we want every child to grow up to be a confident reader so that they can be successful at Portsdown Primary and beyond. Encourage your child to read books (which they will bring home), magazines, recipe books, directions and signs when out exploring.

Reading in school

All children have an independent reading book at their level which they choose from our amazing library. In KS2, they have an opportunity to read every day (often listened to by an adult) and they are able to bring library books home to share with an adult too.

What is Destination Reader?

Destination Reader involves exploring a range of good quality text types from themes of friendship, nature, feeling like an outsider, migration and conservation. In year 3 until the Summer Term they will be reading in groups. From the Summer Term in year 3 and in year 4, we learn reading as a whole class and they focus on learning one reading skill a week. In year 5 and 6 they will learn and practise a variety of skills each week. Many of the books we read allow children to extend their knowledge of the world around them. Our aim is to create a love of reading and children who are able to explore the world for themselves. Destination reader is taught 5 times a week.
