
Year 5 Newsletter

Science

This half term, we are learning about forces and will explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object. We will also identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces. Finally, we will recognise that some mechanisms, including levers, pulleys and gears, allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.

English

This half term, we will be reading 'Wolf Wilder' and exploring the themes of heroism and relationships with nature. We will write a narrative continuing on the story from what we've read. We will also write a non-fiction paragraph about wolves. Furthermore, we will write an action scene to create suspense. We will focus on different sentence patterns to make our writing more interesting; conjunctions to extend our ideas; and dashes for parenthesis.

Computing

In this unit, we will look at how a flat-file database can be used to organise data in records. We will use tools within a database to order and answer questions about data. Pupils will also create graphs and charts from their data to help solve problems. Finally, we will use a real-life database to answer a question, and present our work to others.

Maths

In Maths, we will be exploring statistics, including negative numbers and interpreting graphs. We will be continuing our fraction knowledge by multiplying fractions by whole numbers. Finally, we will develop our mental arithmetic skills for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Please continue to encourage your child to learn their times tables facts and also number facts for fluency (number bonds, doubles, near doubles) these may sound easy but if we know these facts it makes the harder concepts easier. Discuss the times tables you are happy with and those you need to practise.

We are continuing to encourage children to work on their times table facts and spelling the 3/4 and 5/6 spelling lists.
