Physical development


This term, the PE focus is athletics, with our sports morning at the end of this half term.

They will also be focusing on forming all their letters correctly, working particularly with curly caterpillar letters and zig zag monsters.




Maths

We will continue with using numbers to 20 and adding and subtracting. We will also be looking at solving problems which involve halving and doubling.

We are learning about making doubles up to 5 (e.g. double 5 is 10) Can you make a double on the ladybird?

Communication and language

The children will be developing language to describe vehicles and how they move. They will also talk about what they notice when investigating floating and sinking.



Literacy

The children will be listening to a range of stories about journeys. They will be retelling the stories, then writing some of their own.

Phonics

In phonic lessons they will be practising all the sounds and tricky words taught so they are really familiar with them. They will be learning to read longer words.

Expressive Arts and design

Children will be exploring printing and creating repeating patterns. They will also be creating space rockets using junk materials.

The children will also be participating in a music workshop, making different rhythms.

Can you make a picture or model of your favourite vehicle?

Understanding the World

The children will be talking about different journeys from stories and their own experiences. They will be taking short journeys in the local area. They will be making comparisons about the different places.

They will be investigating different vehicles that move and how far they can roll. Also they will be exploring how different objects float and sink.

In technology, they will be using Beebots and trying to program them to move to different places on a map.
