Physical development


This term, the PE focus is athletics.
The children will be practising a range of athletics skills.


They will continue to develop their handwriting skills, practising forming letters correctly and keeping letters the same size.

In maths, they will be learning about number patterns and counting beyond 20. They will talk about numbers that are greater or less than another number. They will also practise their number bonds to 5 and 10.


Can you remember all the ways to make 5?

Communication and language

The children will be retelling a range of traditional stories. They will be talking about the characters in the stories. They will continue to learn a range of poems and rhymes.

Literacy

The children will be listening to and retelling traditional stories this year, such as Little Red Riding Hood. They will be answering questions about what happened about the story.

Phonics

We continue to be amazed with how the children have been working in their phonic lessons. The children are practising reading words and new tricky words.

The children will be using their phonic skills to write their own stories based on the stories they have heard.

Can you answer questions about the stories you are reading?



Expressive Arts and design

The children will be creating their own trolls using pastels. They will also work together to create a new blanket for Granny by decorating fabric.

Can you make a drawing or painting of your favourite fairy tale character?



Understanding the World

The children will be exploring bridges and will think of ways of creating their own bridges for the troll. They will explore how to make their bridge stronger.

The children will go on a Summer walk around the school. They will be finding out about places that are special to some people, such as churches and temples.

They will have the opportunity to use a laptop, learning how to log on and type their name.
