Science

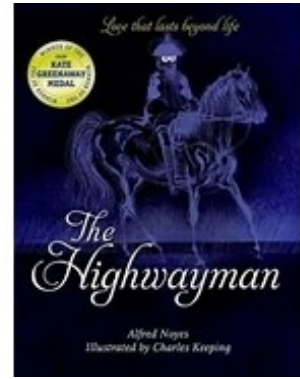
This half term, we are learning about materials and their change of state. We are exploring reversible and irreversible changes and will be planning and conducting experiments.
