At our school we believe safeguarding is keeping **everyone** safe. All the adults around you think that your health, safety, and welfare are very important. We teach you to recognise risks in different situations, and how to protect yourselves and stay safe.

How will we keep you safe?

- We think it is important that children know where to get help if they are worried or unhappy about something.

- Bullying you
- Touching you on a part of your body that you do not like.
- Try to give you tablets, cigarettes, drugs, or alcohol.
- Sending unkind messages on the internet or to your phone.
- Hitting or hurting you.
- Trying to make you change your mind or your opinion.
- Making you say things that you do not want to.
- Giving you money or gifts if you do something for them.
